## **The Bedroom**

We will NEVER experience all of what God had designed when we attempt to bring into the BEDROOM what we've been taught by the WORLD. You want your bedroom to be a playground, not a battleground. The points below will help you develop a new outlook – *from this day forward*.

### **1. CHANGE our crazy ATTITUDES.**

First we need to understand what Scripture says about sex; it is designed to be inside the boundaries of marriage. We are not banned from sexual pleasure, we are just told to WAIT! What baggage from your past do you need to get rid of that taints your view of sex and intimacy? Are you able to put your relationship with God first, before your relationship with your spouse? Why do you think sexuality and spirituality go together?  
*Genesis 2:22, 25; Proverbs 24:3; 1 Timothy 4:4; 1 Corinthians 6:20*

### **2. CREATE a new ATMOSPHERE.**

Intimacy is a shared experience. It is also an all-day experience. Men and Women: ask yourselves what things can you do to create an atmosphere of affection? What are some things you used to do that you need to start doing again?  
*1 Peter 3:7; Psalm 128:3; Proverbs 5:18; 1 Peter 3:3; Ephesians 5:28*

### **3. COMMIT to the new ADJUSTMENTS.**

Research shows that the majority of couples care deeply about their mate, even though they are experiencing difficult times. Take heart, there is hope! When you look at yourself, what changes do you need to make in your life that will help your relationship thrive? How can becoming broken before God help you rebuild your life and your relationship with your spouse?  
*1 Corinthians 7:3-4; Psalm 26:2-3; Romans 5:5; Romans 15:13*
