God wants us to know who we are in Christ and to have a healthy identity of ourselves. In order to overcome in life and maintain the identity God wants us to have, we need to know who and what we are fighting against. As you read through *Romans 7:15-25* you will see the battles the Apostle Paul faced, how to overcome them, and win as Paul did.

THREE BATTLES WE FACE:

1. The battle **against** us.
Discuss the enemies we face as we go through life.
John 10:10; 1 John 2:15-17; Galatians 5:16-17
2. The battle that **surrounds** us.
How can we stand and defeat the obstacles in our life?
Ephesians 6:10-18; Romans 8:37-39; Romans 10:12-14
3. The battle **within** us.
The devil only wants us to doubt God. What does His Word say about you?
2 Corinthians 5:17; John 15:15; Ephesians 2:10

FIVE STEP PROCESS TO IDENTIFY THEFT:

1. The step of **I got this**.
Why should we always maintain an attitude of humility?
Proverbs 14:12; 1 Peter 5:6-11
2. The step of **I blew it**.
What does God's Word say to do when we make a mistake?
1 John 1:9; Proverbs 28:13
3. The step of **I'm no good**.
How can we overcome feelings of a poor self-worth?
Romans 8:1-2; Galatians 5:1
4. The step of **it will never change**.
How are we able to continue to have hope that our circumstances can change for the better?
2 Corinthians 5:7; 2 Corinthians 4:17-18
5. The step of **I give up**.
Who can we always turn to when we are tempted to give up?
Romans 7:24-25; 1 Corinthians 15:57; 2 Corinthians 2:14

- Stay humble. Ask God for wisdom and stay accountable to other Christians.
- Ask God and others for forgiveness when you blow it.
- Don't let the devil condemn you by speaking poorly about yourself.
- Never give up! You are more than a conqueror through Christ who loves you.
